Phrasal Verbs

There are different types of phrasal verbs:

A) Transitive (needs an object)

'Can you please fill out the form'

Some phrasal verbs only have the object at the end

'I am looking forward to my holiday'

Others can have at the end or in the middle

'Can you turn off the TV?'

'Can you turn the TV off?'

B) Intransitive (doesn't need an object)

'I get up at 6am every morning'

C) Transitive/Intransitive (they can be both)

'I wake up early'

'I woke my sister up early'

'Her hair is reddish'

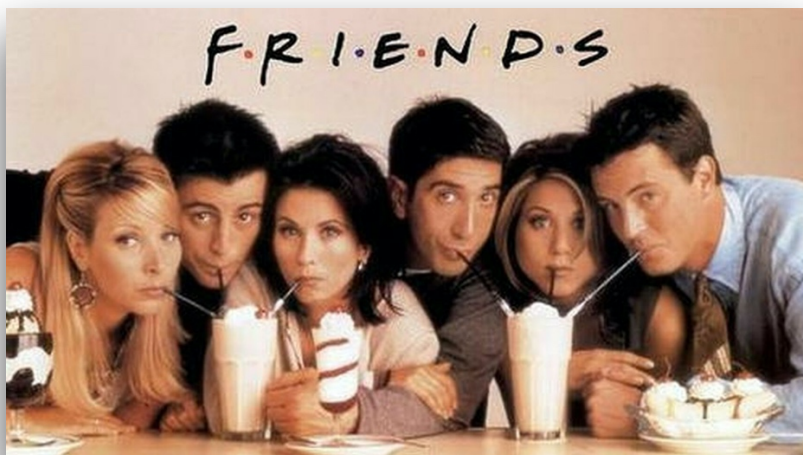
It can also be used as an answer
