Gerunds

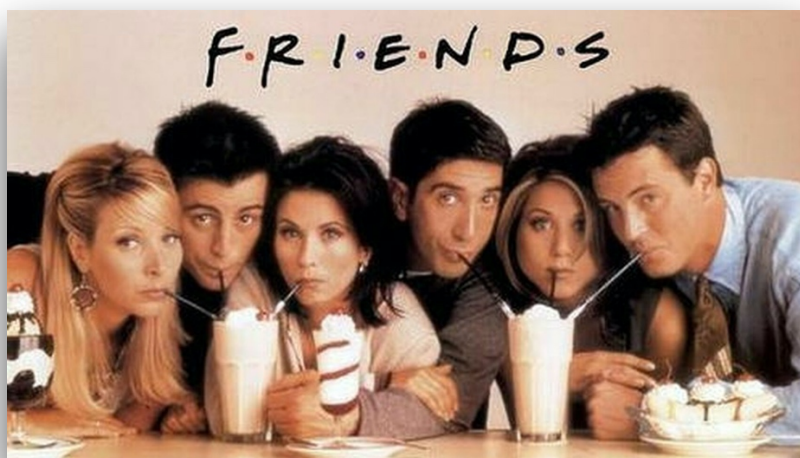
The following always use the gerund after: suggest, enjoy, can't stand, avoid, miss, keep, mind, regret, admit, deny

Infinitives

The following always use the infinitive after: would like, need, decide, threaten, agree, learn, plan, promise, refuse, appear, hope, offer, wait
