WOULD (USED TO)

Would+ verb can be used to have the same meaning as 'used to'. Meaning you regularly did something in the past. It has to be used with something you did repeatedly.

Unlike 'used to' 'would' can only be used with action verbs in this context, whereas 'used to' can be used with both action and state verbs. In the second sentence below 'would' is not possible.

'When I was young I would/used to visit my grandma every weekend'

'When I was a child I used to love swimming, but not any more'

In the following sentences decide if both options are possible or only 'used to':
